Batik art is a textile technique that uses wax and dye to create beautiful patterns on fabric. Originally from the island of Java in Indonesia, the technique of batik painting goes back to at least the 12th century. While similar in appearance to tie-dying, the process for how to batik is a bit more complex, with hot wax applied to fabric prior to dye application and then removed. This method is known as dye resistance, with the wax serving to shield certain areas from being exposed to the dye for a varied, crinkled look upon completion.

Join us to learn how to make Batik cloth for clothing, décor or accessories of any kind. The weeklong process allows for social engagement while working and fostering each others' creativity. No prior experience necessary.

The word "sentence" comes from an old Latin word, "sentire," which means to feel. How do writers use the senses to feel their ways into deliciously specific sentences? In this writing workshop, we'll draw inspiration from food, music, fragrance, and color as well as from stories and poems that make different senses come alive on the page.

We'll explore strategies to build clarity in our writing while playing with creative word-wondering tools like etymologies and color dictionaries. We'll find our own favorite sentences and learn how to create the same effects in our writing. Lastly, we'll practice stringing sentences into powerful paragraphs and even stitching our paragraphs into conversation with other paragraphs (our own or those of others!) by using transitions. Time will be devoted to reading, discussion, writing experiments, and group games that embody the bridge between senses and sentences.
