Child Development and the Basics of Waldorf Education

This class will be centered around the study of two of Rudolf Steiner's basic books on Waldorf Education: *The Education of the Child* and *The Kingdom of Childhood*, taking a detailed look at child development from birth to adulthood, and how Waldorf education is implemented through the various phases.

Theosophy
