Campers work through sections, read music, and learn how to stay together as an ensemble. With guidance from Mrs. Haddy, practice time becomes a chance to slow down and settle into the sheet music without feeling rushed. Paying attention to each measure and how the bow is used to shape the music in a way that feels intentional and expressive.

A good fit for students with playing experience and for incoming fourth graders who are ready for a deeper start.
